### Sailing Secretary Report

The year started very well with good sailing on New Years Day; there was very little current and the SW force 2-3 wind gave 4 boats a good sail. Fortunately the rain held off until lunch. 21 members came to the club. Good sailing continued every Sunday until near the end of April.

BUT by the Mid-Thames Trophy event at Desborough SC on 28 April there was too much current to tow boats up river to Desborough and they had to go by road. At Desborough it was just possible to make way against the current. There was no sailing for the next 3 Sundays because of the strong current; the first time we haven't been able to sail in May for over 20 years.

Unfortunately this set the patten for the year with it being the wettest on record. The Environment Agency have a system of red or yellow boards at locks to warn of dangerous conditions. Last year none were put out and the year before about 100, this year there have been about 1700.

We had a very big publicity drive for the Open day and had 59 visitors; near the most we have had. But on Saturday there was current, little wind and boats were towed upstream to drift back.Sunday was a little better. Six new members joined but generally for the rest of the year sailing has been terrible for them.

There was excellent sailing the next weekend. A visit to Bewl was scheduled for Monday the 4 July but the extremely wet and cold weather forecast put people off and no one went; there were only 6 Bewl boats out.

The Fun on the Water day didn't happen because of the current.

We were extremely lucky to have ideal conditions for the evening cruise to the Weir Hotel for a meal; there were 20 members in 4 dinghies, 3 cruisers, and a row boat.

We were fortunate that there was plenty of wind and not much current for the important Regatta and SigneT Open Meeting. It was very gusty/shifty and during the Sunday Novelty race the novelty was a squall with torrential rain and gusts up to 28 knots.

Other Bewl activities prevented us going on our usual date of the August Bank Holiday Monday and they invited us to go the following Saturday with camping over to Sunday. It was a super visit; very sociable and excellent sailing in 8 to 12 knots of wind.

We had a few glorious days sailing but races were cancelled on 7 Sundays; by far the worst we have had..

I thank all our duty officers for their reliable support; without them we couldn't race. In particular I would like to thank Pat Irving for preparing a super BBQ lunch every Sunday.

### 2012 PRIZES

The race series match those of last year and the same trophies have been awarded. Everyone who had a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd for Boat Handicap or Personal Handicap result in a main series, the Easter Egg or the Regatta have been included in the ranking and receive prizes; the fun series are excluded.

If helm capsize or have any other incident or breakage would they please make sure it is recorded on the race sheet so it can be include in my result records; needed to allocate the Water Rat Trophy.

There was some close racing and it is nice that 7 members receive trophies, and no one has more than 2.

The Tumbling Waters Trophy is presented to the most improved helm; John Panting has been making steady progress and rarely misses races This year he won the Regatta and the Spring Series on Personal Handicap and deserves the most improved helm trophy.
